Creek Hospital was conceived, said that Portland health care providers had long coveted Clark County. We were the first to commit to being part of Clark County four years ago, and "Today we have become part of the community."

The new hospital will employ about 600 full- and part-time people, about a third of whom were Legacy Health System employees who worked in Oregon but live in Clark County.
