During their regularly scheduled meeting at 10 a.m. Tuesday, July 12, Clark County commissioners again will hear an appeal of a permit to allow J. L. Storedahl & Sons to continue mining gravel at their Daybreak site on East Fort of the Lewis River in northern Clark County.

Twice the county hearings examiner has given the Cowlitz County company permission to go forward with gravel mining on the river, provided that the company provide environmental mitigations over the life of the mining operation.

The permit approved by the hearings examiner allows expansion of existing surface mining onto 178 acres of an approximately 292-acre site.

No public comment, oral or written, will be accepted during the public meeting.
