

Sherwood cabinet company expands to Ridgefield

Sherwood, Ore.-based Pacific Crest Custom Cabinetry, has bought 15 acres in the Ridgefield Commerce Center southwest of the I-5 Ridgefield junction. The commerce center is an 11-lot industrial subdivision being developed by Specht Properties Inc.

The company will build a 180,000-square-foot manufacturing building that will employ about 50 persons when it becomes operational in the spring of 2007. The Sherwood operations employs 61 persons.
