Bridge repairs require a full closure of SR 14 eastbound. The closure will begin at 8 p.m. on May 12. The highway will reopen by 6 a.m. on Monday, May 15

Comcast complaints way down

The number of customer complaints regarding Comcast cable and high-speed internet service fell by nearly 40 percent during 2005, which followed a 50 percent reduction in complaints during 2004, according to the City/County Telecommunications Commission's annual review of the performance of the company.

During 2005 the total number of complaint calls to the cable TV office decreased from 111 during the previous year to 67. according to the report.

During 2005 Comcast gained 662 customers for a total of 79,194 cable customers as of Dec. 31, 2005. The increase in Internet subscribers was much more dramatic. By the end of 2005 Comcast had 46,426 high-speed Internet customers, an increase of 6,519 customers.

The company currently has over 2,000 miles of cable in the county and has the capability of serving a total of nearly 152,000 homes.

Comcast took over Clark County cable operations from AT&T Broadband in February 2003. Its current contract extends through Dec. 31, 2012.
