Vancouver architectural ornamentation lecture subject at Museum after Hours

Vancouver's early sculptured terra cotta, intricate brick patterns and wooden gingerbread architectural ornamentation, as well as its modern glass building fronts, are subject matter for **Derek Chisholm**'s 7 p.m. lecture and slide show, "Architectural Ornamentation in Vancouver," at the Clark County Historical Museum's Thursday After Hours program, 5 to 9 p.m. Thursday, May 3, in the museum at 1511 Main Street.

Vancouver resident Chisholm is a senior planner for Parametrix, Portland. He is a former manager of the Clark County Historical Preservation Program, a Vancouver Planning Commission member, and a member of the board of directors of the Washington Trust for Historic Preservation.

The museum's current exhibits, "Vancouver Uncovered," "Woven History: Native American Basketry," and "John Whitehead: Vancouver's Grandma Moses?" will be open.

There is no admission fee during the after hours program.
