C-TRAN moving toward renewable energy

C-TRAN is believed to be the first transit agency on the west coast to use B100 biodiesel fuel in a bus, according to C-TRAN board director **Tim Leavitt**. Leavitt said that the bus using the renewable energy source, vegetable-based oil, will not emit any carbon or sulphur dioxide.

C-TRAN will also begin using B5 biodiesel on the rest of its fleet, according to Leavitt. The transit agency retrofitted its fleet in 2006 to accommodate low-sulphur diesel fuel.

In addition, C-TRAN is retrofitting exhaust systems on all buses to reduce 40 to 50 percent of harmful emissions.

In 2008 the agency will take delivery of 12 forty-foot electric hybrid buses.
