Pink Power Gone Wild! event raises more than \$500,000; Breast cancer survivor announces multi-million dollar pledge for Southwest Washington Medical Center Breast Care Center construction

The excitement and enthusiasm generated by more than 700 Clark County area women enjoying an evening of food, fashion and entertainment, all to raise money to fight breast cancer at the "Pink Power" fundraiser Thursday night reached a crescendo with the announcement of a major donation.

During the event, organizers announced a pledge of \$2.5 million from Lee and Connie Kearney to support construction of a new Breast Care Center on the Medical Center's campus.

Connie Kearney is a member of the Southwest Foundation Board and a 10-year breast cancer survivor.

"I know the importance of proper diagnosis and treatment of breast cancer, as well as the emotional impact it has on women and their families," said Kearney. "We believe in supporting a facility that provides a seamless approach to care by combining the finest medical expertise and technology with a genuine desire to protect the emotional well-being of its patients."

With the support of corporate sponsors, ticket sales, and individual donations, the Pink Power Gone Wild! Event raised more than \$500,000.
