Early October open houses presenting plans for a 33.2-mile trail along the Chelatchie Prairie Railroad from the mouth of Burnt Bridge Creek at Vancouver Lake to Chelatchie Prairie in northern Clark County are being presented in two open houses by the Clark County Public Works Department and Vancouver-Clark Parks & Recreation.

Funding for the proposed project is being provided by a federal transportation enhancement grant, dedicated real estate excise taxes and the Clark County road fund.
