Workforce Development Council gets boost in state funding

Because of increased population and because some communities in the southwest Washington region have not been keeping up with economic recovery elsewhere in the state, the State Employment Security Commission has allocated the Southwest Washington Workforce Development Council \$4.9 million, up \$260,000 from last year, for job skill assessments, training and job referrals for laid-off workers and for those who have dropped out, or at risk of dropping out, of school.

Last year the local workforce council provided training for 768 people and placed 1,020 local residents into jobs.
