There is no charge to attend the session, but donations of cash and canned goods for local food banks will be accepted, according to O'Mahoney.

Auditor recommends that Environmental Public Health Programs set goals and objectives

Environmental Public Health Programs provides services related to permitting and inspection of food establishments, solid waste facilities, onsite sewage systems, and both recreational and drinking water resources.
