The volunteers also set up cots in the Mountain View gymnasium for officers who remained at the scene in between shifts. In addition, volunteers provided emergency workers with Burgerville coupons.

Separate facilities were set up for three evacuees who were displaced during the incident, according to Disaster Action team captain **Chuck Prochnow**.
