

Don Benton, Ken Evans going to China as part of a language tour group

State Sen. **Don Benton** (R-17th) and Yacolt Elementary School principal **Ken Evans** are part of a group of 11 Washington State legislators and six state K-12 educators selected to participate in a nine-day tour of China sponsored by Hanban, an organization promoting the teaching of the Chinese language around the world.

Benton, who has been to China twice before, says the main purpose for his participating is to see for himself how competitive China is becoming economically.

"It is also an opportunity to discuss why teaching Chinese in more Washington schools would benefit our state," Benton said.

Evans, whose school is in the Battle Ground School District, said the tour with other educators will help learn how the Chinese language could be taught in Washington primary and elementary schools.
