Vancouver gets \$3.2 million offer from iQ Credit Union for downtown buildings

The City of Vancouver and iQ Credit Union today announced an agreement, subject to approval by the city council Monday, May 21, to buy two city buildings near City Hall for a new iO corporate headquarters and downtown branch.

The credit union has offered the city \$3.2 million for the former Citizens Service Center, 1313 Main Street, and the smaller Eberle Building at 110 E 13th Street. The multi-story Citizens Service Center formerly was the First Independent Banks corporate headquarters.

City manager Pat McDonnell said that the proceeds of the sale will be held in reserve with the understanding that they would be earmarked for a replacement citizen service center downtown so that city employees who were temporarily relocated to east Vancouver would be returned. The east Vancouver sites are under a five-year lease.

Multiple offers were received on both buildings, according to **Matt Newstrom**, city real property specialist. Newstrom said city staff will recommend iO's offer because of their proposed purchase price and the outline of their intended use and planned renovation of the property, which is consistent with the city's long-term goals for downtown redevelopment.
