
Bill Fromhold gets honor from state Wildlife and Recreation Coalition

State Rep. **Bill Fromhold** (D-49th) has been presented the Award for Outstanding Legislative Leadership by the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition. The award was presented by former governors **Daniel J. Evans** and **Mike Lowry**.

Fromhold, who chairs the House Capital Budget Committee and is a member of the Appropriations Committee and the Appropriations Subcommittee on Education, is credited with increasing funding for the state wildlife and recreation program to \$100 million for the 2007-2009 biennium, double that of the previous biennium.

Said Fromhold: "I have always believed that our state can have a healthy environment and a strong economy. In fact, it's our abundance of outdoor recreational opportunities that draws millions of tourism dollars here each year."

The biennial wildlife and recreation budget will fund 135 projects throughout the state and was endorsed by Washington Realtors, Boeing, REI, the state associations of counties and cities and the state Fish and Wildlife Commission.

Sweeping C-TRAN changes scheduled for November

C-TRAN's must significant transit improvements are scheduled to begin Sunday, Nov. 18, with closure of the 7th Street Transit Center and opening of the 99th Street Transit Center at Stockford Village, reports C-TRAN executive director **Jeff Hamm**.

The changes, originally scheduled for this month, had to be postponed because the 99th Street Transit Center could not be completed on time.

Other C-TRAN service changes include extended service hours on many routes, new service to Portland's light rail at the Expo Center, and a safe stop program permitting passengers to request stops between regular bus stops after 8 p.m.

Randy Mueller withdraws from Ridgefield council race

Saying, "I am not so conceited as to believe that I am the only person who can do a good job serving the citizens of Ridgefield," candidate for the Ridgefield City Council **Randy Mueller** announced he is withdrawing from the race. Mueller Wednesday said he filed suit in Clark County Superior Court to have his name removed from the Nov. 6 ballot because he is accepting a job with the Port of Ridgefield.

According to Mueller, the job with the port might give rise to a conflict of interest or the appearance of a conflict of interest if he were also a member of the Ridgefield City Council.

Mueller's departure from the race for position 2 on the Ridgefield City Council leaves two candidates for that position. **Jeff Siodin** and **David P. Taylor**.
