Katheryn Angelo died today, funeral will be Friday at St. Joseph Church


Katheryn Angelo, wife of nearly 60 years of ex-mayor Al Angelo, who died March 23, died today in Vancouver at the age of 79.



County employment up by 400 jobs

Clark County's non-farm employment declined by 600 jobs in July. But, after factoring out seasonal layoffs, primarily in education, employment rose by 400 jobs, reports **Scott Bailey**, regional economist for the state Department of Employment Security.

Total non-farm employment stood at 136,500, an increase of 3,700 jobs—2.8 percent—above a year ago, Bailey said.
