
Bank of Clark County to open branch in east Vancouver

The port proposal calls for an overpass crossing the Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad right-of-way at Pioneer Street and for closing the two grade crossings at Mill and Division Streets.

An overpass would be a safety improvement, according to port officials, and would also allow trains to move through Ridgefield faster, with less whistle blowing.
