Vancouver and Portland port activities produce \$3.5 billion annual income

The ports of Vancouver and Portland, including the Port of Portland's Portland International Airport, generate 83,316 jobs in the region annually that produced \$3.5 billion in annual income, according to statistics discussed by officials of the two ports in a meeting at the Port of Vancouver Tuesday.

The largest single contributor to port-related income in the region is Portland International Airport, where direct, indirect and induced jobs produce \$1.8 billion in income annually. Port of Portland's direct, indirect and induced jobs produce

\$1,427 billion annual income. The Port of Vancouver's 5,913 direct, indirect and induced jobs produce an annual income of \$285 million.
