Columbia River Crossing Project planners will meet with members of the public individually during three public meetings scheduled this month and in August.

The proposed \$2 to \$6 million project calls for improvements and/or replacement of the twin Interstate 5 Columbia River bridges to improve safety and mobility. Planers expect to recommend one of four plans by this November and to call for a draft Environmental Impact Statement to be completed in the spring of 2008.
