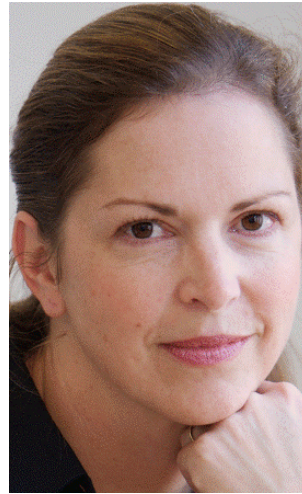


Canal Road ad agency opens in Old Town
