Operation Fairy Godmother is the largest prom dress collection in the northwest, according to **Jan Redding**, spokeswoman for the school district foundation. More than 100 volunteers will be on hand to make selections easy. However, Redding advises girls to arrive early because the waiting lines will already be long much earlier than 10 a.m.
