Port of Ridgefield pledges \$2 million

toward Pioneer Street rail overpass

The Port of Ridgefield has begun the process of raising an estimated \$12.5 million overpass on Pioneer Street with a pledge of \$2 million. The overpass would link downtown Ridgefield with its Lake River waterfront recreational area. Construction of the project is tentatively scheduled to begin in 2010.

The project will also allow closure of two at-grade railroad crossings, including the Mill Street crossing, which is currently rated as the fifth most dangerous crossing in the state. Closure of the crossing will speed up freight and passenger movement through Ridgefield.

"Increasing freight mobility in Ridgefield will also promote redevelopment and employment at the port, and will also preserve and promote job growth and economic development in the entire Portland-Vancouver metro area," says Port commissioner Roy Randel.
