Free admission to the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site is being offered by the National Park Service on Thursday, June 19, the official date of the induction of the fort site as a national monument by the National Park Service. The Congressional Act that created the Fort Vancouver National Monument was signed by President Harry Truman on that day in 1948. Originally more than 90 acres were set aside to commemorate the story of the fur trade in the Pacific Northwest. A subsequent act of Congress enlarged the original monument side and changed the name to the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site. The site's normal hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Visitor fees are \$3 for adults, \$5 for a family.
