Murray, Baird to discuss student loan report at Clark College

At a news conference in Clark College Tuesday, Aug. 5, U.S. Sen. **Patty Murray** (D-Wash) and U. S. Rep. **Brian Baird** (D-3rd) will discuss companion legislation calling for an end of discrimination by college loan organizations against community colleges.

Murray has already introduced a proposed Prevention Student Loan Discrimination Act in the U. S. Senate. Baird says he will follow with similar legislation in the House.

The proposed legislation would "mandate that lenders that receive federal subsidies can't deny loans to eligible students based on the school they attend, the length of their college program or their income level."
