Gregoire falling behind in Clark County votes

Gov. **Chris Gregoire** was leading arch rival Republican **Dino Rossi** in the first count of Clark County votes after the August 19 primary election 27,195 to 25-875. A surprising upturn in Gregoire's political fortunes in this county which voters gave Rossi the edge over Gregoire in the 2004 general election by a whopping 13,090 votes. But, Gregoire won the general election statewide by fewer than 200 votes.

Gregoire's good fortune in this year's Clark County primary election didn't last long, however. By last Friday, after the county elections office had counted 76,271 ballots, Rossi was leading Gregoire by 874 votes.
