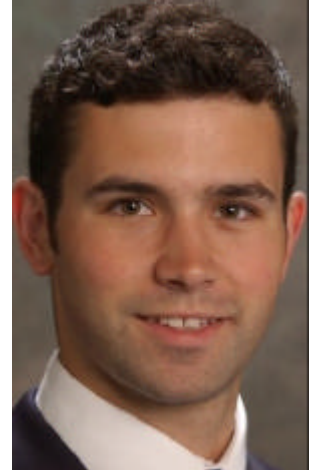
Poling is a graduate of Oregon State University and is a member of the United Way, the American Cancer Society and Young Professionals of Portland.
