Bridget Schwarz will be an Independent candidate for Clark County commissioner



Bridget Schwarz, Clark County native, today announced her intent to become an Independent candidate for the post of Clark County commissioner currently held by retiring Democrat Betty Sue Morris.

Schwarz, born in Portland to a pioneer Clark County family, has spent most of her adult life in the Fairgrounds neighborhood north of Salmon Creek, where she is a member of the Fairgrounds Neighborhood Association and is a former president of that organization. Schwarz is also a member of the board of directors of the national Neighborhoods USA organization.

In order to run as an Independent candidate for county commissioner, Schwarz will hold a nominating convention from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, May 4, in the Three Creeks Library. To be nominated, Schwarz must have signatures from 100 commissioner District 1 voters.

Schwarz graduated from St. Mary's Academy in downtown Portland and is a 1998 graduate of Leadership Clark County. She is the executive director of Friends of Clark County, a member of the Assistance League, Juvenile Justice Community Restorative

Service, Master Gardners, Soroptimist International of Vancouver and former member of YWCA Family Night.

Schwarz, who currently works for Vancouver physician Kelly Lindgren, is a former entrepreneur and manufacturers' representative for electronic products.


