Swindell, serving his second term on the Ridgefield council, is a former member of the Ridgefield School District. A fifth generation county resident, Swindell is a Republican.

He will be running for the position being vacated by retiring Democrat **Betty Sue Morris**, who served three elected terms as commissioner after having served eight years in the state legislature.

Precinct caucuses begin

at 1 p.m. Saturday

Clark County Republicans and Democrats begin the process of selecting delegates, and thus presidential candidates, for their national conventions at 1 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 9, in most polling places in the county.

For Democrats, the meetings, held at the precinct level, will determine how delegates to the national convention will vote. For Republicans, that determination will be made through both the caucus process and the Tuesday, Feb. 19, presidential primary. Republicans will allocate 49 percent of the delegates based on the caucus results and 51 percent on the basis of the presidential primary vote.
