Tenure is awarded by the Clark College Board of Trustees to instructors who have exhibited professional excellence and outstanding abilities in their disciplines.

Earning tenure were the following:

Lori Ellerbroek, nursing. With the college nursing department since 2001, Ellerbroek is a graduate of the University of Portland and earned a masters degree in nursing from Oregon Health and Science University.

Kanchan Mathur, mathematics. Mathur is a graduate of Delhi University and holds a masters degree and doctorate from the Indian Institute of Technology.

April Mixon, chemistry. Mixon is a graduate of Shippensburg University and holds a masters degree in chemistry from Oregon State University.

Julian Nelson, German. A faculty advisor for the college German Club, Nelson is a graduate of San Francisco State University and earned a doctorate from the University of California-Davis.

Katherine Sadler, history. Sadler joined the history department at Clark in 2005. She graduated from Portland State University and earned a doctorate from the University of California at Los Angeles.

Nancy Sheppard, nursing. Sheppard earned an associate degree in nursing from Lane Community College and continued her education at the University of the State of New York and upon graduation earned a masters degree from the University of Portland. She holds a post-masters certificate as a family nurse practitioner from George Washington University.

Ian Titterton, culinary arts. Titterton is certified by the City and Guilds of London Institute. He holds a bakery science technician's certificate from the London Borough Polytechnic. He is certified by the American Culinary Federation as an executive pastry chef and culinary educator. Larry Ham named C-TRAN Employee-of-the-Year

Larry Ham, C-TRAN operations planning supervisor, has been chosen as 2007 Employee-of-the-Year, reports C-TRAN executive director/CEO Jeff Hamm.

Ham, who has been with C-TRAN since 1994, was cited for his work in helping implement the most far-reaching service changes in the transit agency's history. Ham was responsible for the closure of the 7th Street Transit Center in downtown Vancouver and the subsequent outreach program with downtown merchants and the public.

Ham last year was named Employee-of-the-Month following the successful work he did in opening up C-TRAN's shuttle service to the Amphitheater at Clark County.

Over six percent of concert goers used the service, which resulted in eliminating then frequent I-5 traffic slowdowns.
