

Fromhold not running for re-election



State Rep. Bill Fromhold (D-39th), who will complete eight years in the state legislature this year, announced today that he will not run for re-election, citing the demands of his new job as executive director of Vancouver-based Mentoring Advanced Placement.

Fromhold said he will complete his current term, which expires in December. The state legislature goes into a short 60-day session later this month.

'I'm announcing I won't be a candidate for this year's election now so that those who might have an interest in the job won't have to wonder whether I am running."

Fromhold's wife, Marcia, who has served as interim Executive Director of MAP since August 2007, will be MAP's assistant executive director.

Scott Keeney, President/CEO of nLight and MAP Chair, said recently, "Their depth and breadth of experience and relationships in education, along with a keen focus on academic rigor and outcomes, is exactly what we need to expand our programs across the state."

Fromhold is chairman of the House Capital Budget Committee and is a member of the House Appropriations Committee and the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Education.

Fromhold will be holding a legislative town hall meeting from 10 a.m. to noon, Saturday, Jan. 12, in the 6th floor hearing room in the Public Service Center.

Carrico is a graduate of Central Washington University and is a member of the American Planning Association.


Robert Maul appointed community development director for Battle Ground
