Two-day conference on city open spaces culminates this evening in public meeting

How Vancouver can continue to create vigrant public spaces: internationally known public spaces expert Fred Kent will discuss this in a public session at 6 p.m. this evening in the Red Cross Building, 605 Barnes Road in Vancouver Barracks.

Kent has been in Vancouver the past two days meeting with groups of people who advocate "vibrant public spaces." New opportunities to create new public spaces are being boosted by development of the Boise Cascade waterfront property, the proposed new I-5 Columbia River crossing, RiverWest in downtown Vancouver, and high-capacity transit.

Construction begins on another **WSU Vancouver classroom**

Continuing to grow as a full four-year campus, Washington State University Vancouver will begin construction in late January on a new undergraduate classroom building. The university awarded the project to Triplett Wellman of Woodburn, Ore., based on its bid of \$16,234,328. Completion is planned for the fall of 2009. The building was designed by Thomas Hacker Architects of Portland.

The project consists of approximately 55,500 gross square feet of space, including thirteen general classrooms of various sizes, two computer labs, and faculty office and administrative support space for the College of Education.



\$16 million WSU Vancouver classroom will provide additional class space for four-year students.

The new building and its surroundings have been designed as WSU Vancouver's first Leadership in Environmental and Energy Design-certified project, earning the LEED silver level distinction under the Green Building Rating System. In addition to continuing the use of building materials common with other campus buildings, the building's interior finish will also feature wood ceiling paneling harvested on-site from a large Douglas fir tree required to be removed.

"This building will finally give us a permanent home for our programs in education," said WSU Vancouver Chancellor Hal Dengerink. "But most importantly it provides some of the additional classrooms that we need to accommodate our four-year students."
