Republican Michael Delevar has filed for representative from the 3rd Congressional District. He joins incumbent Democrat Cheryl Crist in an attempt to win the post from incumbent Democrat Brian Baird.

The list of candidates trying to succeed in earning Democrat Betty Sue Morris's open job as Clark County commissioner District 1 has grown to four. Joining candidates Republicans Tom Mielke and Brad Lothspeich and Democrat **Pam Brokaw** is **Robert Nichols**, who lists no party preference.

Filing for public office continues through 5 p.m. Friday, June 6. The state's primary election has been moved up to Tuesday, Aug. 19. Unlike in past years, the top two vote getters in each race, regardless of political party, will run in the Nov. 11 general election.
