

## Welcome, **Salmon Creek** Grand Opening





Clark Public Utilities is about \$6 million ahead of projections for the year, reports director of finance **Rick Dyer**. Almost all of the higher revenue is the result of higher revenue from power sales and lower-than-expected power supply costs, according to Dyer.

Nevertheless, anticipated higher costs for wholesale power in 2009 will require utility commissioners to consider a rate increase effective early next year, according to **Wayne Nelson**, Clark Public Utilities' general manager.

This year, through August, the utility added 1,400 new electric customers and 200 new water customers.
