Phillip Haberthur Receives 2009 George C. Marshall Public Leadership Award

Phillip Haberthur of Battle Ground has been named the 2009 recipient of the General George C. Marshall Public Leadership Award. He will be recognized during a ceremony at 4 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 4, at Marshall's former Vancouver home, the Marshall House, 1301 Officers Row. The ceremony will be broadcast on CVTV. This year marks the 21st anniversary of this prestigious community award honoring the legacy of one-time Vancouver resident General George C. Marshall.
