It is also an opportunity for Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation to introduce The Intertwine, an ever-growing network of regional parks, trails and natural areas in the bi-state area, and the Intertwine Alliance, a group of non-profits, state and local agencies, businesses and people from across the region working to preserve and promote parks, natural areas, open spaces, water and wildlife habitat.
