Open house at Clark County Sherriff's Office West Precinct

The Clark County Sherriff's Office West Precinct is having a public open house about the on-street parking restrictions in the Mount Vista area near Washington State University, Vancouver. The open house is from 6 to 8 p.m. tomorrow, Aug. 11, at 505 NW 179th Street.

In 2008, a group of residents north and west of the WSU Vancouver campus asked the county to restrict onstreet parking. Surveys conducted in spring 2009 showed that a majority of residents living on Northeast 147th, 148th and 150th Streets and 26th Avenue favored the change.

Clark County Public Works is seeking additional input before making a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners. If approved, the county would restrict on-street parking along Northeast 147th, 148th and 150th Streets between 29th and 26th Avenues, and on Northeast 26th Avenue between 147th and 148th Streets. Other roads north of Northeast 150th Street could also be affected.
