

Gov. Gregoire appoints new ecological director

Gov. **Chris Gregoire** has announced the appointment of **Ted Sturdevant** as the director of the Washington State Department of Ecology. Sturdevant has spent the past seven years as Ecology's director of governmental relations and replaces **Jay Manning**, who recently joined the Governor's Office as Gregoire's chief of staff.

"Ted knows this agency—he has a strong familiarity with its priorities and challenges, and already has an excellent working relationship with agency staff, the environmental community, tribes and the business community," Gregoire said. "I am confident that Ted will work with people in every community and industry to ensure Washington state remains a place in which we're all proud to live."

Before joining the senior management team at the Department of Ecology in 2003, Sturdevant worked under Gov. **Gary Locke**, leading Locke's external affairs team. Sturdevant has also worked for Rep. **Mike Nelson** and Rep. **Tony Federici** in Oregon.

In 2008, Gregoire presented Sturdevant with the Governor's Award for Leadership Management.

Press conference to be held for Tim Leavitt

Mayor-elect **Tim Leavitt** will discuss his plans to move forward once he assumes office on January 1, 2010, at a press conference to be held at 3:15 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 11, in the Firstenburg Community Center, 700 N.E. 136th Avenue, Vancouver.
