Nearly 50 cars, trucks, trailers and other equipment were auctioned off through Clark County Department of Public Works last Tuesday at the Cowlitz County Fairgrounds, bringing in a total of \$175,700.

Charley Masco, Clark County Department of Public Works' operations manager for fleet and facilities, expected the auction would bring in only half that amount. "We were pleasantly surprised," Masco said. "I think there's a pent-up demand for cars, but people can't afford a brand new car."

Many of the vehicles were no longer needed because of staff downsizing in health, building and other areas of county government. Several vehicles also had relatively low mileage, such as a 2003 Chevrolet Malibu, previously used by Clark County Public Health, which had 21,183 miles and sold for \$4,750.
