### SWWDC to release request for an estimated \$1.2 million in youth services.

The Southwest Washington Workforce Development Council (SWWDC) will release a Request for Proposals on Dec. 17 for the delivery of services to in-school and out-of-school, low-income youth ages 16-21 years old in Clark, Cowlitz, and Wahkiakum Counties under the Workforce Investment

Act (WIA), Title I. Total funds available are expected to be approximately \$1.2 million. Actual allocations will not be known until May 2010.

Contracts resulting from this RFP are anticipated to begin July 1, 2010, and end June 30, 2011, with an option for renewal for up to three years (through June 30, 2013) without further solicitation.
