Vancouver mayoral race tight

Vancouver city councilman Tim Leavitt is trailing Vancouver mayor Royce Pollard in first election returns from Tuesday's primary election—but it is close.

Early election returns give Pollard the lead in the balloting, 7,286 votes to Leavitt's 7,097. Charlie **Stemper**, the only other candidate, collected 2,526 votes.

Pollard and Leavitt will face each other in the November general election.

In other Vancouver council races, incumbent Jeanne Harris is leading challenger Anne McEnerny-Ogle with 57 percent of the vote.

Former councilmember **Jack Burkman** received 36 percent of the balloting.
