County growth slowing way down

Clark County's rate of growth has slowed to the lowest in the last four years, according to Clark Public Utilities' records for new residential electric hook-ups.

The current growth rate is .59 percent, as measured by the number of new residential customers as of February 2009.

During February the utility signed up just 55 new customers. In January this year the utility signed up 108 new customers.

The net total new customers for 2008 was 2,060, for an annual rate of growth of 1.23 percent.
