Dozer Day play structure donated to local children

Hanson Pipe, Frontier Landscaping, and The Nutter Foundation have teamed up to create a 71-ton one-of-a-kind play structure for children living at Aurora Place Apartments, 8105 NE Fourth Plain Boulevard, an affordable housing complex owned by Second Step Housing.

The massive structure was first used last week during Dozer Days.

the ton!" because the 70- by 10-foot structure consists of 71 tons of concrete shaped into tunnels and tubes for children to climb through.

The structure was so massive it required a 80-ton crane to place it on the Aurora Place property. It was installed yesterday.
