Leadership Clark County's board of directors elected **Jason Beatty**, **Michael J. Ciraulo**, and **Kelly Sills** in September, increasing the membership to a total of 18 members that oversee the nonprofit's operations. The new members will each serve a three-year term.

**Beatty** is vice president and owner of Techjet Imaging, a company that provides large-format digital graphics. He was included in the *Vancouver Business Journal*'s "2006 Accomplished and Under 40" list. His business has won this entrepreneur numerous awards for innovation and growth.
